- (1) Kenneth Reed matriculated in 1936 and read *Modern History*. On the outbreak of war he joined the RAF and was killed in action in October 1942 while serving with 252 Squadron in North Africa.
- (2) Of the original twelve, one gave up, one was sent down and four pursued careers in the Law. The rest went into Banking, Social Services, Welsh Television, Tory Politics and the Catering Trade.
- (3) I was in the RNVR and during the Cuban Missile Crisis sealed orders arrived for me from the Admiralty with a rail warrant for Rosyth. In our year only six freshmen had been in the Armed Forces.
